The Sustainable Juice Covenant

What is expected of you?

- ▶ Commit to aim to source 100% Sustainable Juice and puree in 2030
- ▶ Report progress annually and allow independent verification
- ▶ Promote the Juice Covenant
- ▶ Share knowledge on sustainability with covenant members

How to reach 100% Sustainability?

- ▶ Joint target setting - aiming for 100% Sustainable Juice and Puree by 2030
- ▶ Certification and verification of supply chain
- ▶ Independent monitoring of progress - Annual monitoring of percentage verifiably sustainable
- ▶ (optional) Issue mitigating projects - Opportunity to apply for co-funding from IDH addressing key sustainability issues in Africa, Asia and Latin America.

What do we count as sustainable?

Fruit and vegetables from farms which comply to the SAI FSA bronze criteria and are verified/certified accordingly, which are processed and packed in its supply chains by ETI/SMETA/SA-8000 certified industry partners.
