HOW TO REACH 100%

SUSTAINABLE SOURCING?

- Certification and verification of your supply chain according to a joint basket of accepted standards
- Annual reporting of percentage of sustainably sourced volumes
- Independent third-party monitoring of progress on an annual basis
- Participate in or set up issue mitigation projects with the opportunity to apply for co-funding from IDH or the SJC

CONSIDER SUSTAINABLE?

Fruit and vegetables from farms with a sustainability certification at least equivalent to SAI/FSA Bronze (based on third-party verification) which are processed and packaged by industry partners that are certified according to a standard equivalent to SSCI (SA8000, BSCI, SMETA, BRCGS or SIZA).*

* full list might change pending equivalency recognition of standards
