

Since 2018, IDH Cassava Program has transformed the industrial cassava sector in Nigeria as a prototype for Africa through market transformation and improvement in business practices, helping industrial processing factories develop inclusive sustainable supply chains projects and linking them to multinational food companies and access to finance. The program also convenes stakeholder platforms for advocacy, policy dialogue and exchange of noncompetitive information.




Our strategy

The program is designed to resolve the greatest constraint in the development of the industrial cassava sector in Africa which is in the supplydemand relationship. Controlled supply chain management, using the block farming model, has been identified as a solution to the inclusive and sustainable cassava production and processing in Africa. This is done by setting up efficient outgrower schemes through which industrial cassava processors can secure supply to fully utilize their capacity. The model is a full-service delivery farming system that provides technology, inputs and training to the farmers, in a contiguous farming environment, in addition to a guaranteed market for their produce. The result is stable and improved income to the farmers and consistent supply of raw materials to the processors. The Rockefeller Foundation supported IDH to implement this strategy in Nigeria

A functionally and mutually beneficial service delivery model, between farmers and processors, in a block farm, backed by affordable finance, is a key success factor for a sustainable outgrower scheme in industrial cassava development in Africa



Technical Assistance

With grant from the Rockefeller Foundation, IDH Industrial Cassava program supports cassava processors to establish a service delivery model that will engender smallholder inclusion and sustainable supply chain management. We are working with 10 processing factories in Nigeria and several multinational food companies.

Through these projects, IDH has transformed market and creates opportunities for inclusive growth of the sector:
