What is the Fair Wage Network?

The Fair Wage Network (FWN) was created in 2009 with the objective of improving wage practices in global supply chains. With more than 50 researchers across the globe, FWN provides three key services to companies: fair wage assessments, remediation and local certification; advisory support to help define and develop a company's overall wage strategy; and an online living wage database with living wage benchmarks for nearly 200 countries and more than 1500 regions and cities. Beyond the Typical Family Methodology which meets IDH's nine criteria for recognition, FWN also uses other methodologies to produce benchmarks, such as the single-earner family methodology. 
