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Introduction to IDH

<u>IDH</u> convenes, co-finances and manages sustainability agendas with multinational and smaller companies, governments and civil society, to accelerate market transformation. IDH is headquartered in the Netherlands and operates globally with over 380 employees in sectors and landscapes, with the support of governments and foundations to deliver scalable, economically viable impact on the Sustainable Development Goals. Our approach includes encouraging joint investment in new models for long-term solutions for environmentally and socially sustainable production and trade. We focus on smallholder farmers and producers of commodities in field projects, multistakeholder landscape approaches, value chain development, and in market convening for positive impact on social and economic outcomes for smallholder farmers. We also work on de-risking investment in smallholder finance through the IDH FarmfitFund, and in blended finance for nature-positive agriculture through our Technical Assistance Facilities for AGRI3, &Green and LDN Fund.

Innovations & Insights (I&I, Business unit within IDH) is mandated to identify innovations and share insights in areas that can support IDH's core mandate of market transformation. Additionally, it also develops an enabling environment that helps promising high-impact innovations scale. The technology sub-unit at IDH is housed under this BU and it has a specific focus on three types of technologies that can lead to market transitions:

- 1. Technologies that can facilitate a net-zero transition in agriculture;
- 2. Technologies that can enable remote monitoring, reporting, and verification of sustainable development outcomes; and
- 3. Technologies that can enhance service delivery to smallholder farmers and agri-SMEs.

This assignment is cross cutting across the three clusters.

Background of the Assignment

Since Its Inception, IDH has Integrated several technology solutions (both digital and on-digital) across Its programs to enable and accelerate its impact. The use-cases of technology are varied and examples range from the use of Information and Communication Technology to enable access to Government schemes In India, to providing access to bundled services to farmers via SMEs in Ghana, to using remote sensing-based technology for monitoring deforestation In Malaysia. The investment arm of IDH has also invested in several technology-driven service delivery models, especially in the domain of digital financial services.

IDH believes that by studying these use-cases and developing case, learnings from IDH's implementation journey can be shared and leveraged by other sector stakeholders from agriculture and food systems that are exploring technology Integration. Given this context, IDH Is seeking the services of a Consultant to develop 5 case studies on technology solutions that have been used within its programs and documenting key learnings from the Implementation journey.

Interested Consultants are requested to submit a proposal by 13th September 2023, 23.59 CET to borthakur@idhtrade.org. The proposal should include:

- 1. Cover letter establishing expertise to undertake the scope of work (max 1 page);
- 2. A detailed CV (Max 2 pages);
- 3. Credentials of similar assignments and research undertaken in agriculture and food systems (max 3 pages);
- 4. Samples of previously published work (if any)
- 5. A budget which clearly establishes the person days and day rate (in Euros) required to complete the assignment;

Evaluation Criteria:

All proposals would be scored based on the following criteria:

Grounds for exclusion:

Consultants would be excluded if:

 a) they are bankrupt or being wound up, are having their affairs administered by the courts, have entered into an arrangement with creditors, have suspended business activities, are subject of proceedings concerning those matters, or are in any analogous situation arising from a similar procedure provided for in national legislation or regulations;



- they or persons having powers of representation, decision-making or control over them have been convicted of an offence concerning their professional conduct by a judgment which has the force of res judicata;
- c) they have been guilty of grave professional misconduct proven by any means which the IDH can justify;
- d) they have not fulfilled obligations relating to the payment of social security contributions or the payment of taxes in accordance with the legal provisions of the country in which they are established, or with those of the Netherlands or those of the country where the contract is to be performed;
- e) they or persons having powers of representation, decision making of control over them have been the subject of a judgment which has the force of res judicata for fraud, corruption, involvement in a criminal organization, money laundering or any other illegal activity.

Confidentiality:

The consultant will ensure that all its contacts with IDH, with regards to the Tender, during the tender procedure take place exclusively in writing by e-mail to borthakur@idhtrade.org. The Tenderer is thus explicitly prohibited, to prevent discrimination of the other Tenderers and to ensure the diligence of the procedure, to have any contact whatsoever regarding the tender with any other persons of IDH than the person stated in the first sentence of this paragraph.
